




WHOIS Query Load




Is there an increased demand for IPv4 space?

For IPv6 space?




IPv4 Requests Received






IPv4 Addresses Issued (in /24s)






IPv6 Requests Received

*through August 31



Sept 1 2007 thru Aug 31 2008




Total templates processed = 3,223

Sept 1 2007 thru Aug 31 2008




Total templates processed = 4,002

Total number of 2008 requests for Legacy RSAs, per month




