

What is the IANA stewardship transition?

- March 2014 –
 NTIA announced transition of IANA stewardship
- Asked ICANN to convene a process to develop transition proposal
- Current NTIA-ICANN contract expires
 Sept 30, 2016

NTIA's Criteria

Support and enhance the multistakeholder model

Maintain the security, stability, and resiliency of the Internet Domain Name System (DNS)

Meet the needs and expectation of the global customers and partners of the IANA services


Maintain the openness of the Internet

Broad community support


Does not replace NTIA role with a government-led or an inter-governmental organization solution






Dependencies on Enhancing ICANN Accountability



- Rights on non-public information transferred to the RIRs


NUMBERS COMMUNITY PREFERENCES:

- All relevant parties agree to these expectations










Oversight components in the combined proposal
